**School Violence Intervention Policies & Procedures**

- District & campus safety issues are reviewed annually &/or as needed by campus & district site base committees to address areas of need or concern.
- Each campus has a crisis management plan & an established system for students & staff to address safety issues & concerns.
- Each campus & department has emergency drills, reviews the data from the drills, & revises campus policies & procedures as needed.
- All staff are trained annually &/or as needed on the District & campus safety policies & procedures.
- County & City emergency officials regularly meet with District personnel to review school safety issues.
- District Safety Committee meets regularly to discuss safety issues that may impact students &/or staff.

**Safety & Drug Free Program**

Safety & Drug Free Reports were provided to District & Campus Site Base Committees, District Safety Committee & Parent Key Communicator Committee. Each group provided input for improving & evaluating the Safe & Drug Free Program. A Safe & Drug Free survey was administered in the Spring of 2005 to students in grades 6-12. Data was analyzed and a summary provided for the public in a variety of formats.

Data from District Discipline Reports indicate that office referrals for alcohol incidents increased from 1 in 2004-2005 to 5 in 2005-2006. Drug incidents increased from 12 reported incidents in 2004-2005 to 19 in 2005-2006.
